TRIAD... Reducing crime & criminal victimization against the elderly.

What is a TRIAD...

TRIAD is a national movement which began in 1988. A triad represents a three-way partnership among a community's older or retired leaders, its local chief of police and its sheriff—to address crime issues which affect the health and safety of older citizens. These three-part TRIAD teams work together to reduce criminal victimization of the elderly and to enhance the delivery of law enforcement services to older persons.

The Carroll County TRIAD

is a county agreement between the Sheriff of Carroll County, the Maryland State Police, Westminster Police Department, Carroll County State's Attorney, Carroll County Bureau of Aging, Carroll County Retires Teachers Association, and AARP Chapter 662.

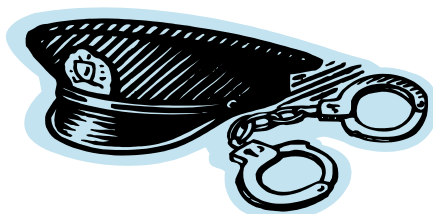
Other organizations may join in the future. Interested parties are always welcome to attend the monthly open meetings.
