



**“Sheriff’s Office arrests four individuals after theft from Walmart”**

**Sykesville, Carroll County, Maryland; December 15, 2025** ---- On Sunday, December 14, 2025, at approximately 11:07 a.m., Carroll County Sheriff’s Office deputies were dispatched to the Walmart Supercenter, located at 6400 Ridge Road, Sykesville, for the report of a shoplifting in progress.

Prior to arrival, deputies were informed that the suspects had pushed carts with Walmart merchandise out of the store without paying and left in a white colored Chevrolet Impala travelling Eastbound on Route 26. Deputies, with the assistance of troopers from the Maryland State Police, searched the area, locating the suspect vehicle in the 6100 block of Monroe Avenue. All four occupants of the vehicle were placed under arrest for the theft from Walmart. In addition to recovering the stolen merchandise, multiple glass smoking devices and containers with suspected residue from Controlled Dangerous Substances were located in the vehicle.

The four suspects were identified as:

Milo Darren Bary-Parhjam, a 35-year-old male with a Baltimore address;

Regina Elizabeth Musa, a 50-year-old female with a Baltimore address;

Kenneth James Parham, a 36-year-old male with a Halethorpe address; and

Lauren Kimberly Thomas, a 43-year-old female with a Friendship address.

(All individuals are presumed innocent of the pending charges until proven guilty in a court of law)

All four individuals were charged with the theft, as well possession of CDS (not cannabis) and possession of CDS Paraphernalia.

Kenneth Parham was identified as the individual in the driver’s seat when they were located. In addition to the above, he was also charged with obstruction, as well as traffic related charges for driving on suspended license and driving vehicle not equipped with an ignition interlock as required by program.

Kenneth Parham and Lauren Thomas were released on recognizance. Regina Musa was released on unsecured personal bond. As of the time of this release, Milo Barry-Parhjam remains in the custody of the Carroll County Detention Center.
