



### “Sheriff’s Office makes arrests for Ulta theft”

**Sykesville, Carroll County, Maryland; January 9, 2026** ---- On Friday, December 12, 2025, at approximately 1:07 p.m., Carroll County Sheriff’s Office deputies responded to the Ulta Beauty located at 6400 Ridge Road for the report of a theft that had just occurred.

Prior to their arrival, deputies were informed that the suspects had fled in a black colored Infinity. A Sykesville Police Department officer was able to observe a vehicle matching that description traveling southbound on Route 32 towards Howard County and provided the Maryland temporary registration that was displayed on the vehicle.

Deputies were able to locate a possible address for the vehicle in Howard County, and officers from the Howard County Police Department were able to locate the vehicle at the address in Jessup, Maryland. Detectives from the Carroll County Sheriff’s Office Major Crimes Unit responded and assisted with a search warrant for the address and vehicles, resulting in the recovery of merchandise from both the Sykesville Ulta location as well as several others. The estimated value of the merchandise recovered was in excess of \$11,000, which was the result of several thefts from regional Ulta stores.

The suspects were identified as Dasjanae Teyona Timmons, a 23-year-old female with a Jessup address, and Dahmira Monya Laboo, a 23-year-old female with a Severn address. A warrant was obtained for both suspects charging them with Theft (\$1,500 - \$25,000) and Organized Retail Theft, which are both felony charges.

On December 17, 2025, members of the Carroll County Sheriff’s Office Warrant Unit apprehended Timmons. She was transported to Carroll County Central Booking and served with the warrant.

On January 7, 2026, Laboo was located in Severn, Maryland, and taken into custody by the Warrant Unit. She was transported to Carroll County Central Booking and served with the warrant. Additionally, upon arrival at Central Booking, Laboo was found to be in possession of items suspected to be Suboxone, a controlled dangerous substance, and was subsequently charged with three counts related to misdemeanor possession.

As of this news release, both suspects remain at the Carroll County Detention Center without bond. The Carroll County Sheriff's Office thanks the Sykesville Police Department, Howard County Police Department, and the Anne Arundel County Police Department Warrant Unit for their assistance in this investigation.
